**BOI Conclusions:** 

As it was a difficult task for the clearance, and required extra attention and care of command group and deminers themselves, thus the carelessness of deminer was the main contributing factor to this accident. The consequence of this accident is a slight injury to the finger of deminer which indicates that he was fully dressed with PPE.

## **Analysis**

The primary cause of this accident is listed as *Unavoidable* because the area was described as "difficult" and it is possible that the Victim was working to approved SOPs when the accident occurred: excavation accidents can happen no matter how cautious the approach. The secondary cause is listed *Other* because the summary does not contain enough detail to derive an understanding of the events at the time.

The "Inadequate investigation" listed under notes refers to the absence of a full accident report. The UN supported MACCA has failed to make these widely available for some years in contravention of the requirements of the IMAS. The failure of the UN to share the Afghan investigators' work with others is regrettable.
